We have identified a few danger areas and these will need to be addressed in the coming weeks. However, the water is good and we do hope that everyone enjoys the upcoming regattas.

Didymo

January 2009

There has been little recent mention of the Didymo problem and it seems that for many this problem has gone away. This is simply not true...it is more of a problem now as it ever was. The current rains has meant there is a lot more water flowing and we have seen rafts of Didymo floating down the lake. Trevor has told us that some of the buoys have it growing from them. The lane wires are 3mm diameter Kevlar but one section recently examined had grown to 15mm diameter with Didymo. It was noted that even the hull of the work barge had some Didymo on it. Didymo is still very much with us.

A better illustration concerns the start trolleys. At the Otago Champs it was found that the boatholders could get no traction and the trolleys could not be wound out very well at all. A diver went in to investigate because all the trolleys had been refurbished over the winter period. He found that there had been a build up of Didymo under the scrapers that clear the rails of stones. This in turn lifted the drive wheels of the trolley and hence the lack of traction.

It is essential that all equipment and clothing that has been in the lake is washed in an appropriate solution before it is taken away from the lake.

New Finish System

For the last four years we have been looking for a better timing system as the old one was well passed it use by date. We also needed a replacement regatta management program and this aspect was common to both SIR and KRI. Following research by RNZ (Kevin Strickland) and some assistance from our local people a new Management program was decided upon. This was fully used for the Canterbury Championship Regatta and while there are a few teething problems the overall progress with implementation is well ahead of schedule.

As the camera and the timing system also needed replacement RNZ facilitated the trial of a system supplied by the Brook Group. The photo finish system is "FinishLynx". This system was implemented at the Canterbury Champs and we are grateful to Brian Davidson for coming over from Australia to facilitate the installation. In actual fact we had no easy way of using the old system for this regatta so it just had to work with a minimum of problems.



While it was new for us the ease of implementation was truly remarkable. Those who were at the regatta were able to see the pictures and the close finishes that were achieved. While we can improve the system further, the initial results were an order of magnitude better that the old system.

Water Safety

Many will be aware of the safety requirements on Lake Ruataniwha. There are signs showing which areas can be used for the various water based activities. This Lake currently is a "shared" activity lake and all users must obey the requirements of the Local Authority's (ECAN) Bylaws which encompass the requirements of MSA91.


The ECAN Rangers have indicated they intend to crack down in this area because of very real safety concerns.
