Boat Park Etiquette

With the construction going on this year, the Boat Park has been stretched to the max, and we thank you for your cooperation in coping with the cramped and sometimes difficult conditions. Here's a few notes for next season:

- The function of the boat park during the regatta is to park boats and transfer rowers and boats in and out of the water. A number of clubs have commented that they prefer to only have coaches, managers and rowers in the boat park, and that it is not an area to set up a base camp.
- If it is a hot day and you wish to debrief your crews, do so under the trees behind please.
- Access is also important; be mindful of other users and if you are not working on a boat then "rack it ".
