New Tower progresses

As can be seen on the photo taken Saturday July 24, progress is right on track for an opening at the end of September for the stunning new tower to complement the new Don Rowlands centre at Lake Karapiro. The old tower was built for the 1978 World Rowing Championships and saw racing of the highest international standard for over 30 years. It was knocked down in just a day or two in June. The new Regatta Manageme nt Centre, which is being built by Hawkins Construction, will have a slightly larger footprint, and be set 2.8 meters further back from the Lake . It will meet the specifications





of FISA for the 2010 World Rowing Championships, and the needs of all future rowing regattas and events at Lake Karapiro. The site, known as Ground Zero, progresses visibly every day and we expect the roof to be on by the end of next week!


