Annual General Meeting

Karapiro Rowing welcomes the East Coast, Wellington and Wanganui Rowing Associations, as part of it's new constitution. The 1st AGM of the expanded organisation saw retiring Chair Don Swales final appearance. Tony Popplewell replaces him. Rowing New Zealand CEO Simon Peterson joins the Board, as does Roger Milne.

New Committees for Karapiro Rowing

New Events and Community Centre

Waipa District Council is replacing the old water sports complex with a new events and community centre, to be ready in June, in time for the FISA World Rowing Championships, October 31st -November 7th 2010. Demolition of the old building was completed last June



and construction of the new building started immediately. During this summer's rowing season there will be some inconvenience to rowers and officials at Karapiro regattas, and due patience is required while we work with the trying conditions. The results will be worth waiting for!
