### Environmental Protection

**Didymo** (aptly called rock snot) is a major problem in the area. We know that it is prevalent in much of the Waitaki and some of the feeder streams. Please note that the practice of washing boats before and after use will remain in place for the coming season.

Wilding Pines continue to be a problem in the area and the SIR land is no different. This particular pest grows quite prolifically and often to the detriment of the environment. We need to keep a close watch on this pest and remove the seedlings while they are young and before they have opportunity to seed.
